REFLECTION for Sixteenth Sunday (B)

In the first reading of today Jeremiah condemned the political class of his time for abandoning the sheep entrusted to their care. Instead of leading them to green pasture, they led them to ruin and destruction. He promised the people that God would in time send a leader, a wise and upright one from the house of David, who would never abandon the flock of God. The gospel passage presents Jesus as that long-awaited leader. St Paul in the second reading tells us that the flock of God is not only Jews, but people from all the races of humanity. Jesus came to gather all the children of God without any distinction of race, colour, or language. (Rev 7: 9-12; Gal 3: 28)

Jesus the promised leader is not like the shepherds of old who abandoned and destroyed and scattered the sheep. No! He is the caring and loving shepherd who is compassionate and kind. He would give up his rest to take care of the flock of God. He would eventually give his life that the sheep may have life, life in abundance. (Jn 10: 10)

All of us in diverse ways are leaders and shepherds. The father and mother are shepherds in the home. The teacher is a shepherd in the school. The doctors and nurses are shepherds in the hospital. Priests are shepherds in the parish.

But there are times, in spite of our good efforts, we feel the heavy burden of the responsibility of leadership. There are times in life we feel so stretched that we want to give up.

When those times come, let us remember that we are not alone, that we are not the only ones feeling that way. Jesus too felt that way. In the garden of Gethsemane, feeling the crushing weight of the responsibility of leadership, he cried out, "My father if it is possible, take this cup of suffering from me!" (Mt 26: 39)

When we feel the burden of leadership or life crushing us, we must not give up. We should do what Jesus did. Fall on our knees and pray. After Jesus prayed, "An angel came from heaven and strengthened him." (Lk 22: 43) If we too in such moments turn to God in prayer, he will strengthen us, just as he strengthened Jesus. Yes, we are shepherds, but always recognise that God in Jesus is our shepherd. If we accept Jesus as our shepherd and trust in him and call to him, he will be there for us. If we are with Jesus, we shall not lack. Yes, you shall not want. Even if you walk in the valley of darkness, among foes, you will not be afraid. Even if you are crushed by heavy burdens, you will not falter, because the Lord will walk beside you to steady you and strengthen you. And when the day comes for life to fade like the fading sunset, the Lord himself will escort you into paradise like he did the thief on the cross (Lk 23: 42-43), to live with him forever and ever. Amen. (cf Ps 23)
