REFLECTION for Eighteenth Sunday (B)

The first reading and the gospel of today are about a God who provides for the people. To satisfy the hunger of the people, God rained down bread from heaven for the people to eat. In the gospel the people asked Jesus to give them bread from heaven just as Moses gave their fathers bread from heaven in the desert. But Jesus stunned the people when he told them, "I am the bread of life; he who comes to me shall not hunger, and he who believes in me shall never thirst." In other words, Jesus said to them, 'do not search too far for bread to eat. The real and true bread is standing before you.'

There are two kinds of hunger that people face: physical hunger and spiritual hunger. Human food satisfies physical but cannot satisfy spiritual hunger. Only spiritual food can satisfy spiritual hunger. One can be rich and successful in material things and still feel hungry spiritually or still experience a spiritual lacuna. In the midst of plenty have you hungered for more? Something your soul longs for but you cannot place your finger on. Something that nothing material, no matter how wonderful and appealing, can satisfy?

If yes, you are not alone; the psalmist felt the same way. "O God, thou art my God; ...my soul thirsts for thee," (Ps 63: 1) Also "My soul is thirsting for God, for the living God..." (Ps 42: 2)

Jesus is the only one who can satisfy that inner hunger and quench that inner thirst. He is the only one who can fill that yawning space in your heart.

He tells us in the gospel today, "I am the bread of life...He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never be thirsty." For his flesh is real food and his blood is real drink.

Do you believe these words of Jesus? How seriously do you take them? How much have you internalised these words? Do you believe that the body of Jesus is the bread of life? Do you believe that it is the food for the spirit, without which the spirit is weak? How often do you eat this bread?

The people were looking for Jesus because they wanted him to give them physical bread. They wanted more of the manna that God gave their fathers in the desert through Moses. Human beings are always expending energy searching for the food that perishes, for material food. But Jesus came to give far more than that bread. He came to give that "bread which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

Why are you searching for Jesus? Are you looking for him for physical bread? Jesus came to give far more than that. Jesus is telling us, "Do not only labour for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life," that is the body of Jesus. How much do you yearn for the body of Christ, the bread of life? (We shall talk more about the Body and Blood of Christ next week.)
