REFLECTION for Nineteenth Sunday (B)

In the gospel of today from John 6 Jesus continues his teaching on his body as the bread of life, which a person may eat and derive spiritual strength, and never experience death.

In the first reading from 1Kgs 19: 4-8 Elijah was frustrated on the way to mount Horeb. He complained to God, "It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life; for I am no better than my fathers." Why was Elijah going to Horeb? He was actually running away. After defeating and killing the 450 prophets of Baal (1Kgs 18: 22), Jezebel sent a message to him saying, "You can be sure that I will kill you, just as I killed the other prophets. I'll do it by this time tomorrow. If I don't, may the gods punish me greatly." (1Kgs 19: 2) Hearing this, Elijah was afraid, and ran.

On the way he felt abandoned, he felt alone, he was hungry. In this state he lay down under the bush and fell asleep. An angel of the Lord came twice, woke him up, fed him with bread twice. With strength from the food of bread from the angel of the Lord, Elijah walked 40 days and 40 nights until he arrived at mount Horeb. (1Kgs 19: 3-8)

Two points to look at here first, from Elijah's life we see that closeness to God does not always shield us from the vicissitudes of life. It is not so much whether we come under the pressure of life, but more how we react. Elijah reacted by challenging God. He was angry, he was hungry, he was tired. Have you felt any of these emotions? Challenge God like Elijah did. I have challenged the Lord too in my moments of frustration and anger.

Elijah's challenge drew not the wrath of God, but the mercy of God. God sent his angel to feed him with bread. And with the strength from the 'heavenly' food, he walked until he got to his destination. Elijah tasted the food from the Lord, not only did the food taste nice, but he also saw that the Lord is good. As Scripture says, Psalm 34: 8, "Taste and see that the Lord is good."

The book of Lamentations captured the feeling, "It is the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed. Because his compassion fails not. They are new every morning: Great is thy faithfulness. The Lord is my portion, saith my soul; Therefore, will I hope in him."

Like Elijah we too are on a journey to the Lord. Sometimes along the way we are angry, we experience frustration or betrayal, we are hungry, especially, spiritually. We feel like giving up. Challenge the Lord as Elijah did. And like God did for Elijah, he will provide us with food to strengthen us. Just like the bread given him by the angel gave him strength to make the journey to the Lord at Horeb. So too, the body of Christ, the bread of life, which Jesus offers, gives us that much needed spiritual strength for the demands of the journey to the Lord.

If you feel empty, sad, abandoned, alone sometimes, if you feel the journey is long, walking on the road less travelled, if you need strength, especially spiritual, if you need lifting up, if you need inner joy and contentment, if you need peace of mind, if you desire to experience the gentle whisper and peace of the Lord, (1kgs 19: 12-13), then go to be fed by the bread of life, the body of Christ. It is the food of angels given to human beings. There is no food more refreshing, more assuring, more filling, tastier, more uplifting, and more satisfying.
