REFLECTION for Twentieth Sunday (B) (ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY)

On Thursday, 15th August, we celebrated the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is the teaching of the Church that the Blessed Virgin Mary, at the end of her earthly life, died, and was taken up to heaven body and soul.

On the **1st of November 1950** with the proclamation of the Apostolic Constitution "Munificentissimus Deus" Pope Pius XII made the solemn proclamation that "we have poured forth prayers of supplication again and again to God, and have invoked the light of the Spirit of Truth, for the glory of Almighty God who has lavished his special affection upon the Virgin Mary, for the honour of her Son, the immortal King of the Ages and the Victor over sin and death, for the increase of the glory of that same august Mother, and for the joy and exultation of the entire Church; by the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and by our own authority, we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory".

The Assumption is the consequence of the Immaculate Conception, and the immaculate conception is the consequence of the Incarnation. The blessed virgin Mary had to be created sinless and immaculate because she was to be the mother of God; God cannot inhabit a sinful body or soul. And because she was created sinless, and because of her special and unique relationship with Jesus, she was given grace in abundance, "full of grace" (Lk 1: 26-28).

According to Pope Francis, to be full of grace means that "Mary is full of God's presence. And if she is entirely inhabited by God, there is no place in her for sin." The Pope continued, Mary is the only "evergreen oasis' of humanity, the only uncontaminated one, created immaculate to receive fully with her 'yes', God who was coming to the world..." The church congratulates Mary today, calling her all beautiful. The Blessed Virgin Mary is the most beautiful, the most loving, the most pure, the most perfect of all God's creatures. Mary's body was so pure, so holy that it radiated God's glory while here on earth.

Assumption of Mary into heaven is a celebration of joy and hope. Joy that Mary our mother is in heaven. Hope that where she has gone, we, her children and fellow disciples will one day follow. It is also an invitation to all of us to follow the example of the blessed virgin in her simplicity, humility, fidelity, life of prayer, dedication to God, love and service of neighbour, total surrender to the will of God. Follow her example in pointing the way to Jesus. She is always focused on Jesus and doing the will of God.

The life of the Blessed Virgin Mary on earth and in heaven is focused on Jesus. She directs our attention to Jesus/God always. At the annunciation Lk 1: 26-38 she said to the angel, "I am the handmaid of the Lord." At the visitation Lk 1: 39-56 she deflected Elizabeth's praises of her to God, "My soul magnifies the Lord." At the birth of Jesus Lk2: 8-14 her focus was on the child Jesus. At the presentation of the child Jesus Lk 2: 22-39, she drew attention to Jesus. At the crucifixion of Jesus, Mtt 27: 32-56 she stood at the foot of the cross focused on Jesus.

After the ascension of Jesus, Mary stayed with the disciples in the upper room praying and keeping their focus on Jesus. Acts 1: 14.
